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1. Economic Sectors

1.1 Manufacturing

Aspiration for Manufacturing Sector

The manufacturing sector is one of the largest contributors to Sarawak's GDP. This sector aims to promote Sarawak as a preferred investment destination for high-value manufacturing. This is in addition to building an efficient ecosystem and nurturing a highly entrepreneurial community.

Manufacturers are looking to diversify their supply chains away to ASEAN countries from traditional powerhouses such as China. The plan will focus on augmenting domestic capabilities to support the shift in manufacturing ecosystems and attract investments to Sarawak.

Figure 1.1.1: Aspiration framework for manufacturing sector

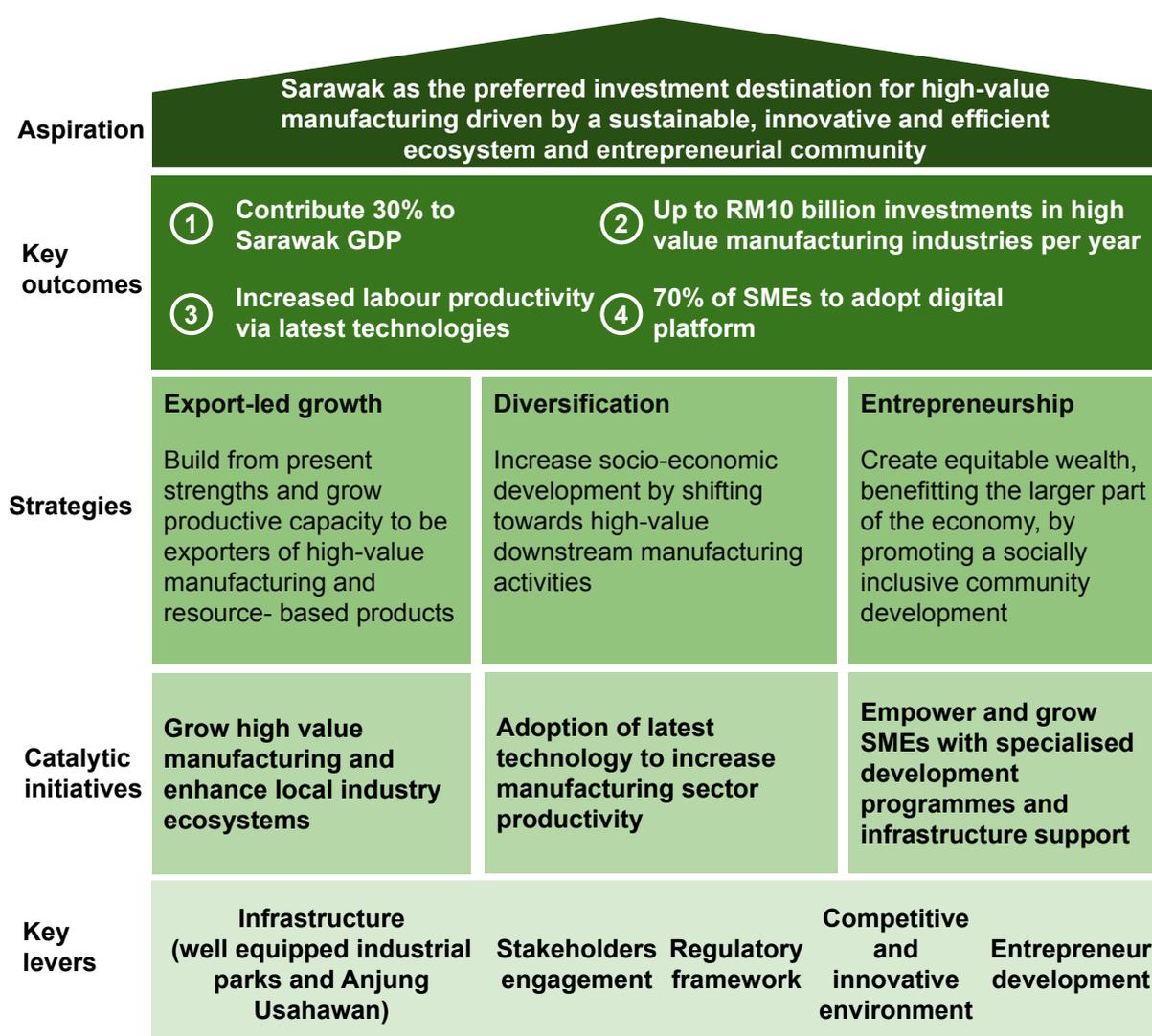
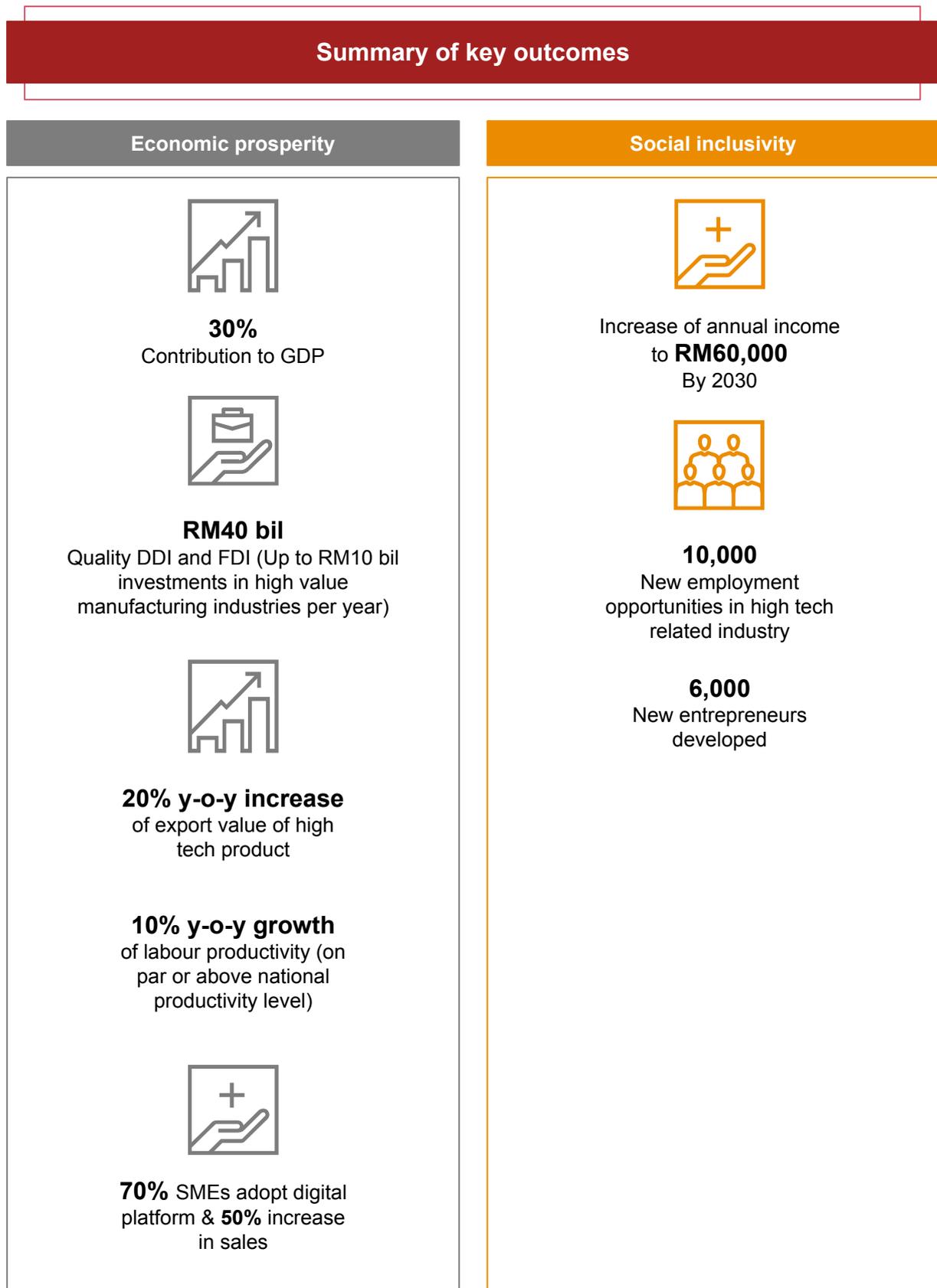


Figure 1.1.2: Summary of desired outcomes for manufacturing sector

1.2 Commercial Agriculture and Agro-Commodities

Aspiration for Commercial Agriculture and Agro-Commodities Sector

Food and Agriculture Organisation (FAO) estimates an 11% increase in global population and rise in per capita income leads to a 15% increase in global food consumption. Asia Pacific is expected to drive food demand as it is the most populous region (50% of global population in 2029).

Agriculture sector plays an important role to Sarawak’s transformation due to its abundant primary agricultural resources that can be capitalised on. The agriculture sector is expected to drive business, create employment opportunities and provide stable income for the rural community. Transformation and increase in production at the upstream level of the agricultural sector will provide ready raw material to support growth of downstream sectors.

This sector aspires to be technology-driven and sustainable, to ensure food security and safety, to create wealth for the agro-based community and to position Sarawak as a net food exporter by 2030. The plan will leverage the abundance of primary agricultural resources and modernise processes to ensure sustainable growth and increased productivity.

Figure 1.2.1: Aspiration framework for commercial agriculture and agro-commodities sector

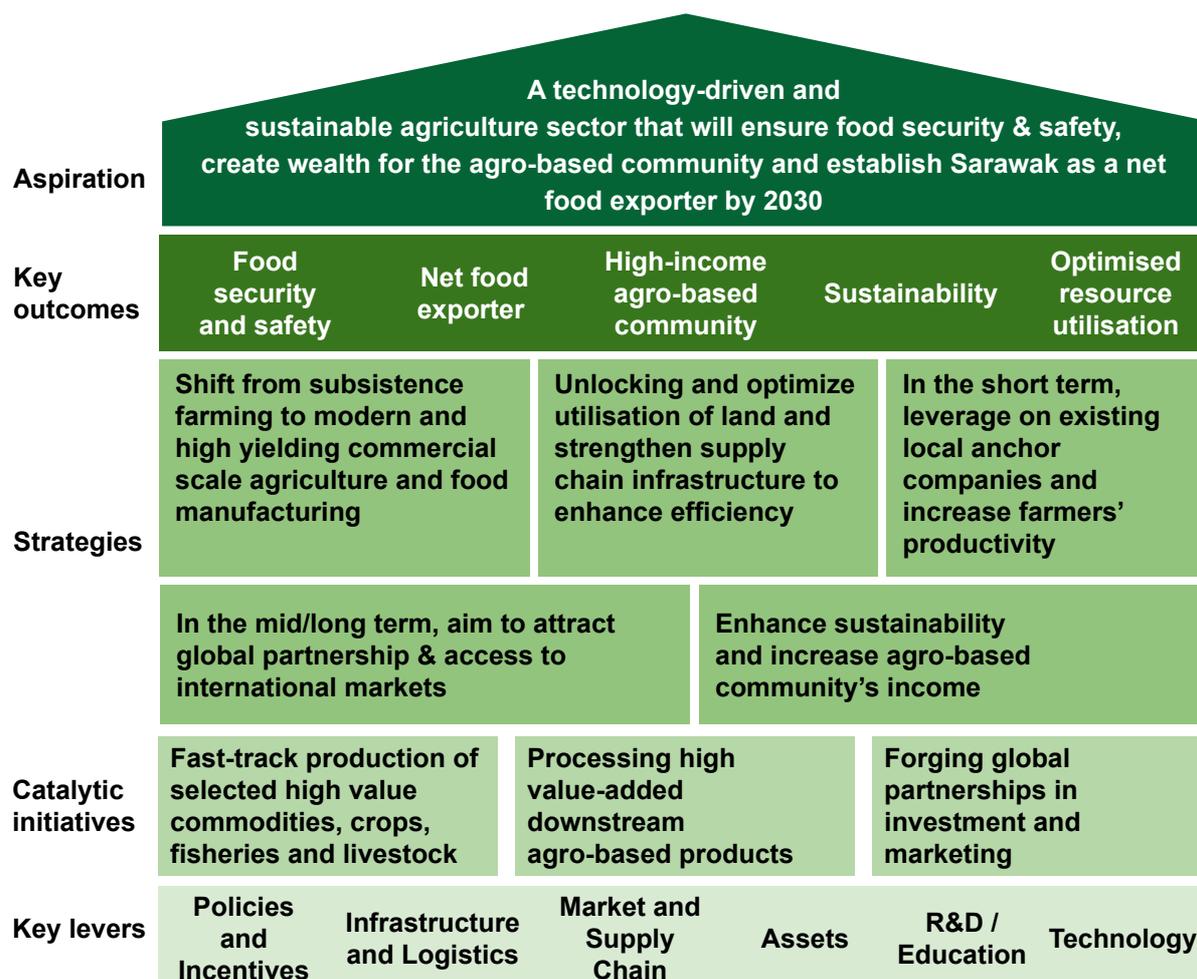
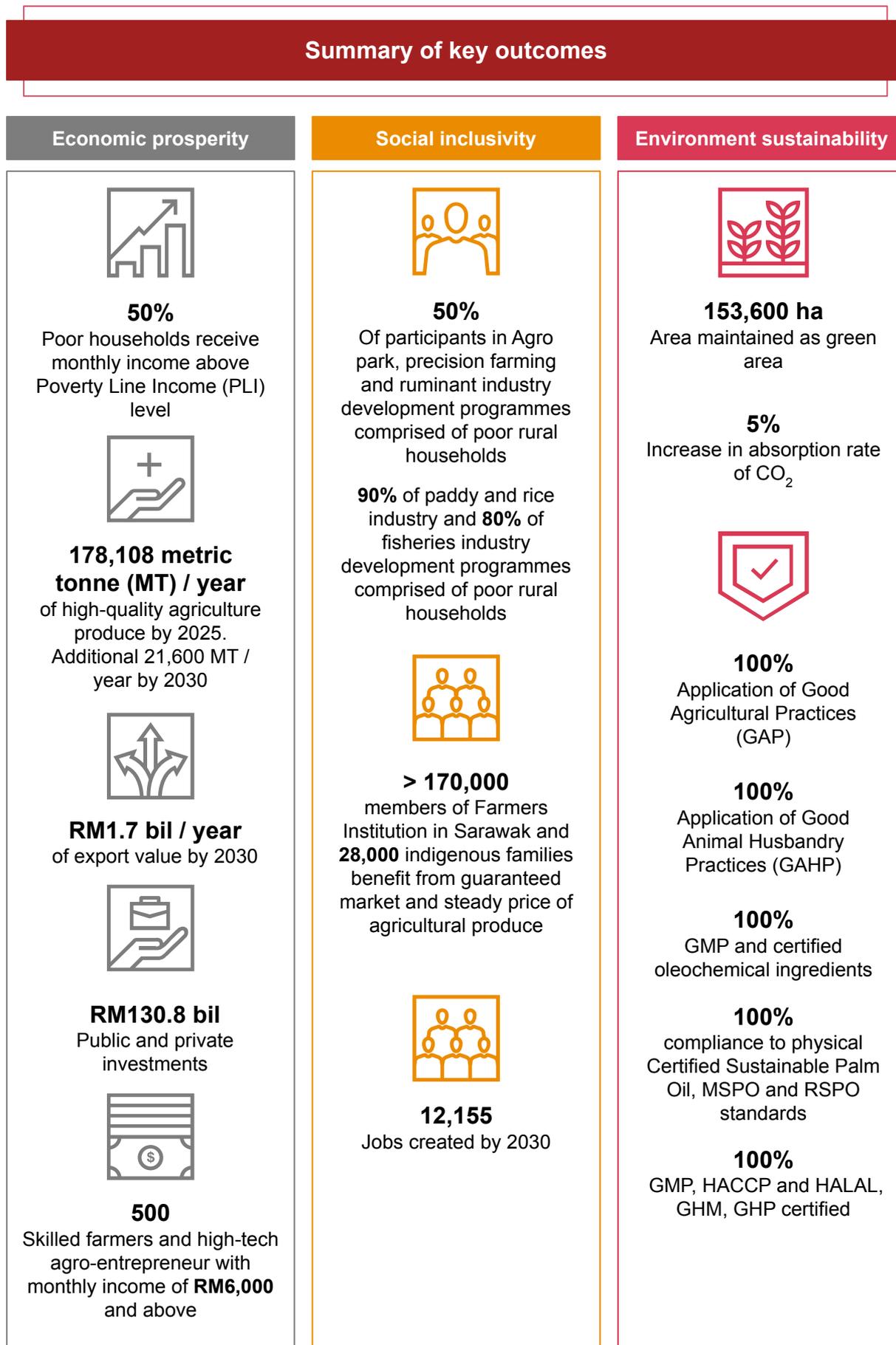


Figure 1.2.2: Summary of desired outcomes for commercial agriculture and agro-commodities sector

Figure 1.3.1: Aspiration framework for tourism sector

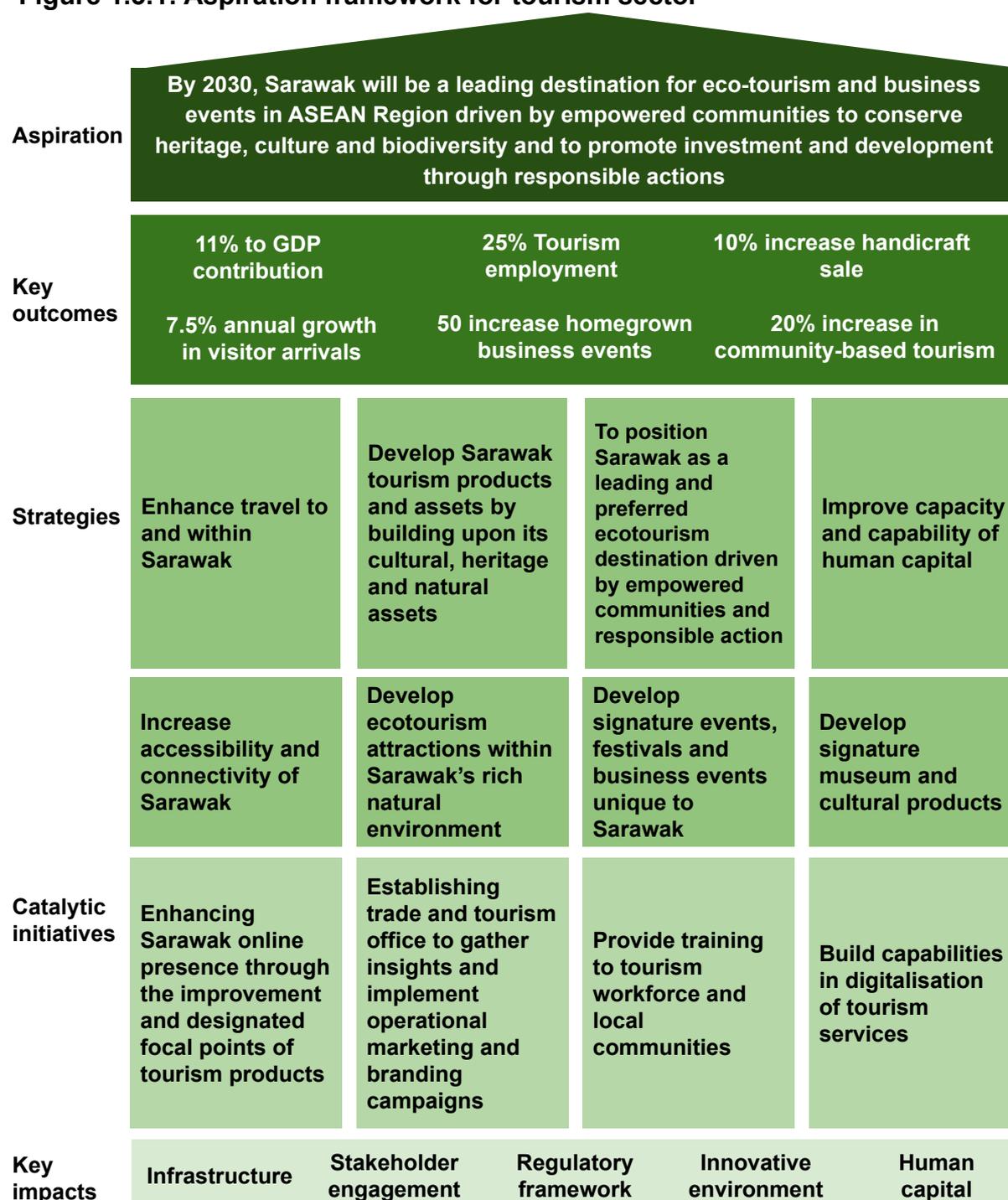
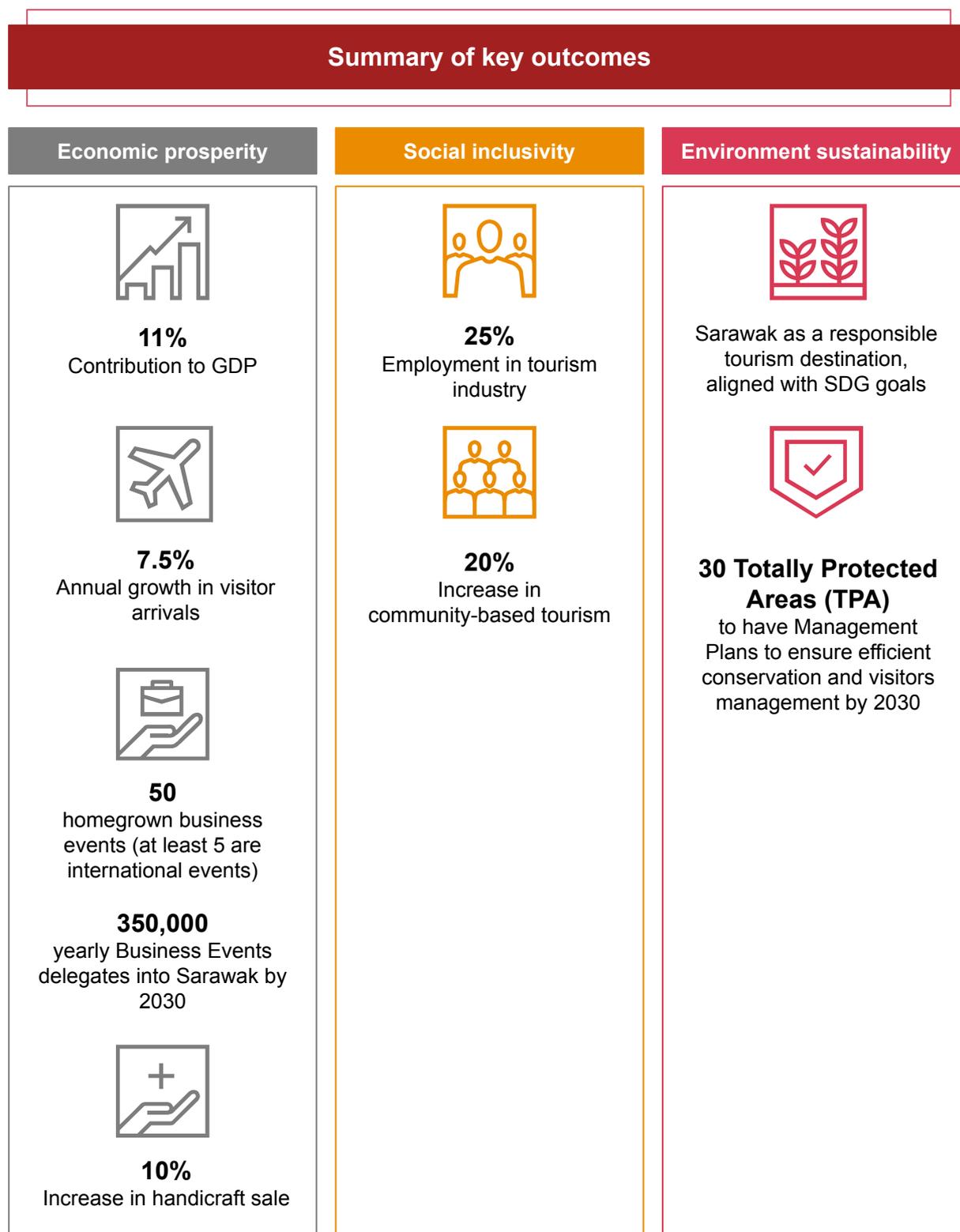


Figure 1.3.2: Summary of desired outcomes for tourism sector

1.4 Forestry

Aspiration for Forestry Sector

The forestry sector aims to practice sustainable management and conservation, and to achieve world recognition. The sector will provide inclusive growth from Sarawak's rich resources by creating economic opportunities for rural communities.

To support aspirations in Sarawak 2030, the sector needs to generate revenue streams from forest resources, and export earnings from the timber industry. In addition, the sector needs to increase forestry's purpose for recreation and tourism.

The focus of forest management practices and stewardship is anchored on the development of a Sustainable Sarawak Blueprint, and balancing the rate of deforestation and growth (i.e. increasing product yield and enhancing services obtained from forests).

Figure 1.4.1: Aspiration framework for forestry sector

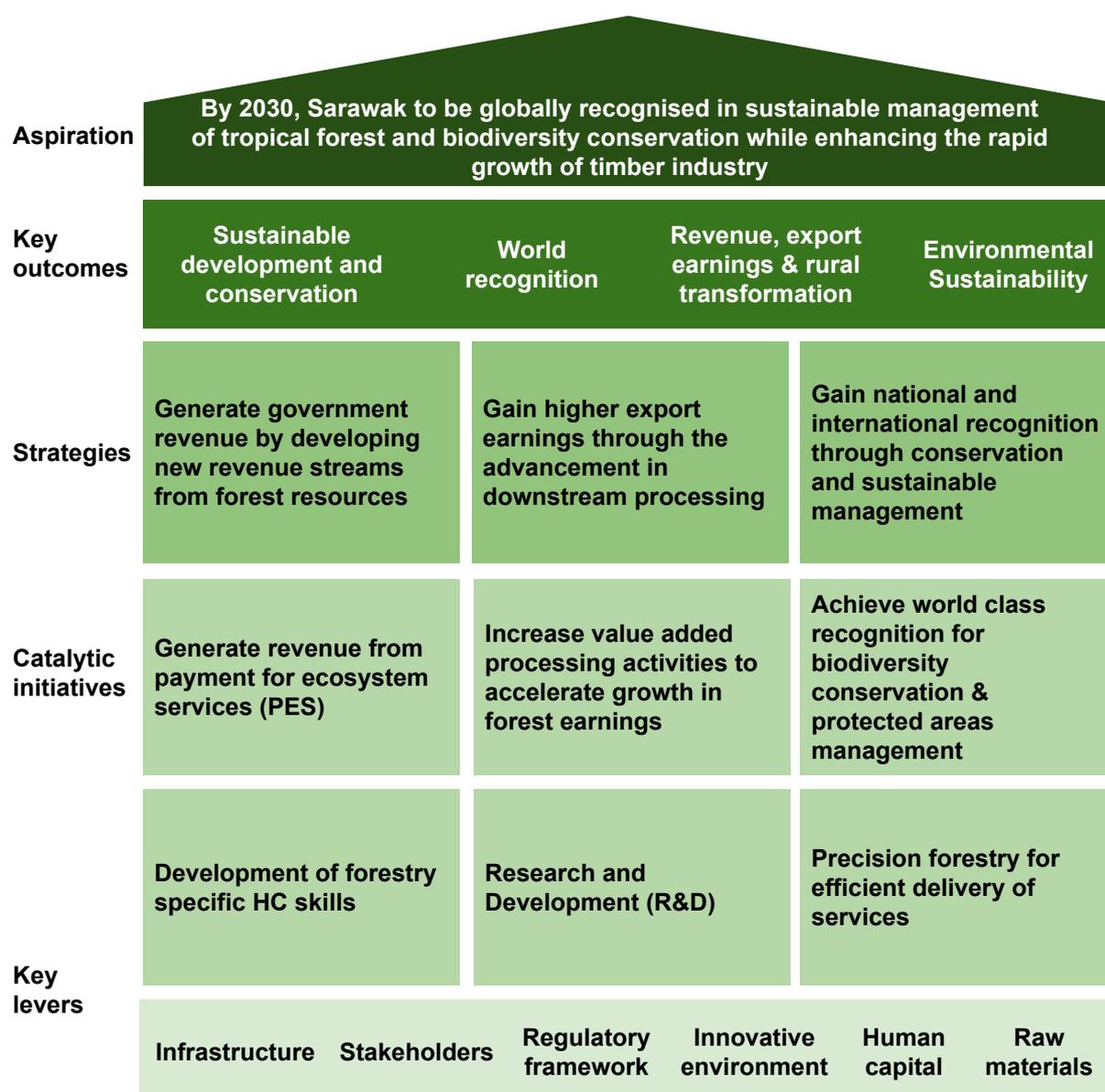
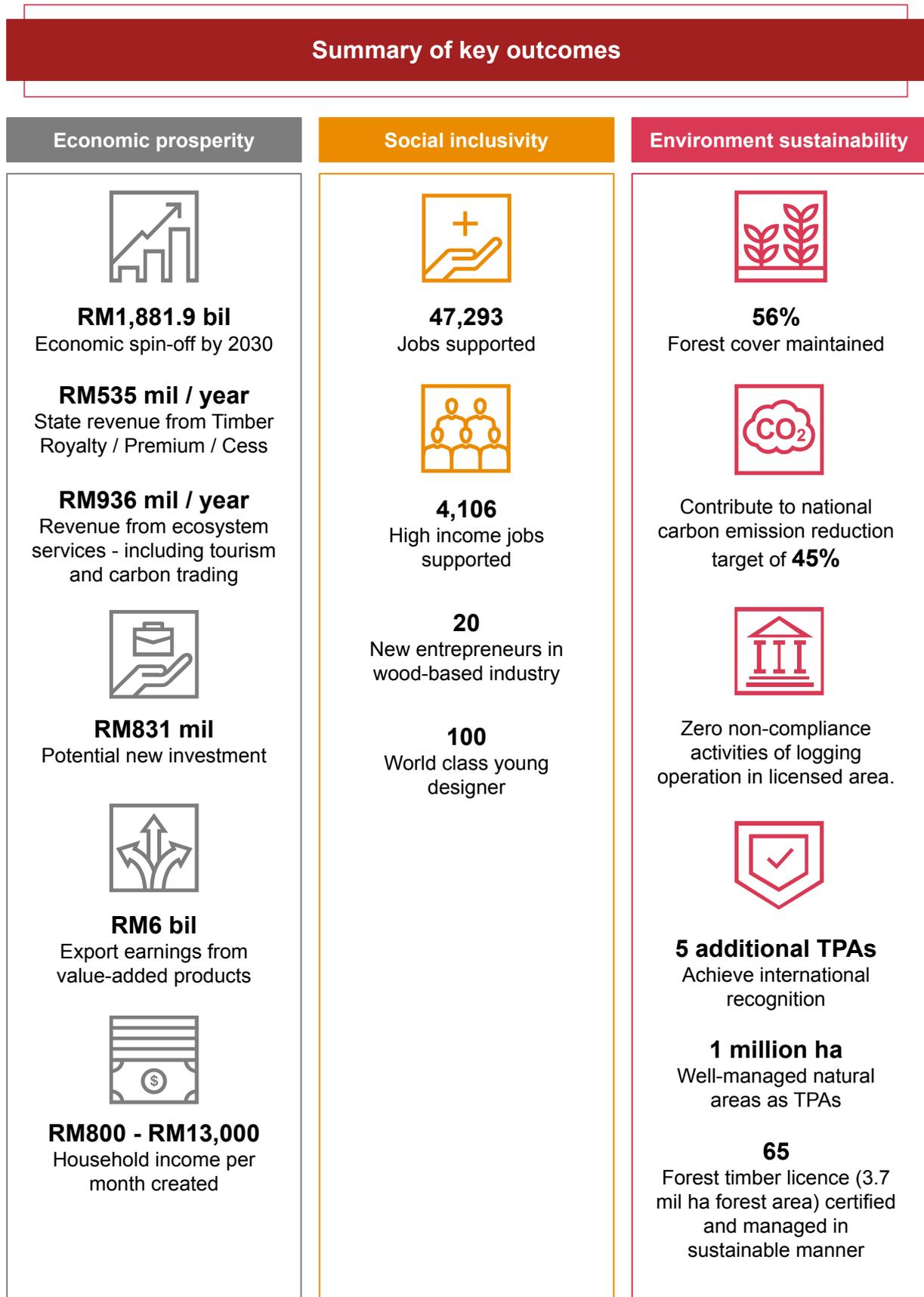


Figure 1.4.2: Summary of desired outcomes for forestry sector

1.5 Mining

Aspiration for Mining Sector

Traditionally, mining in Sarawak consists mainly of oil and gas activities. Although these will continue to be important, mineral exploration and processing will mark a new avenue of growth for the sector. Mineral demand is on the rise with unabated demand for green energy that requires heavy minerals, e.g. energy storage, as the world moves towards low-carbon aspirations.

Mining activities in Sarawak will be expanded to minerals and value-added activities will be highly encouraged. Sarawak has potential to leverage its mineral resources in a value-added way. Effective implementation of initiatives and policy recommendations will attract strong investors and create key industrialisation areas in the State.

Figure 1.5.1: Aspiration framework for mining sector

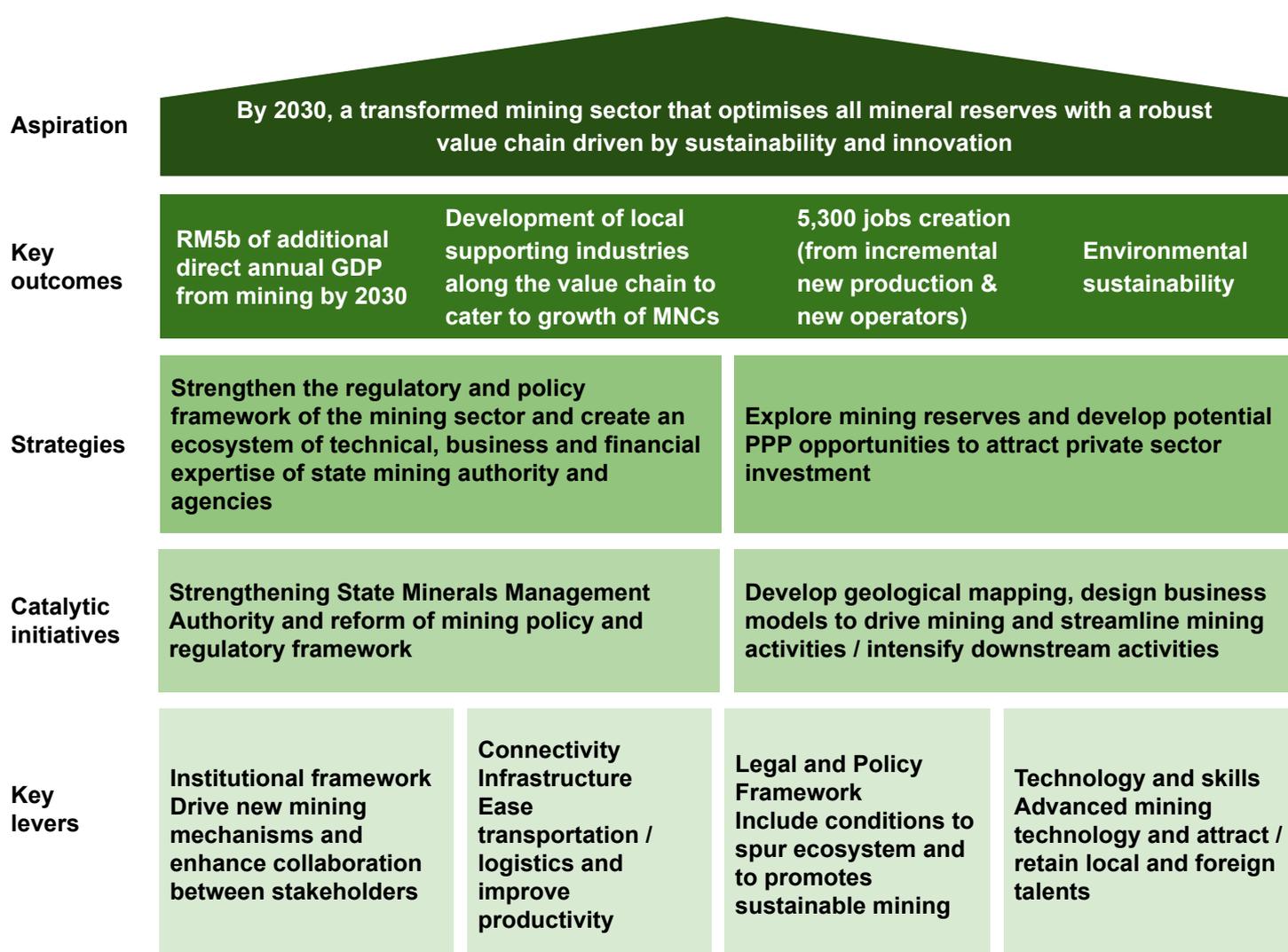
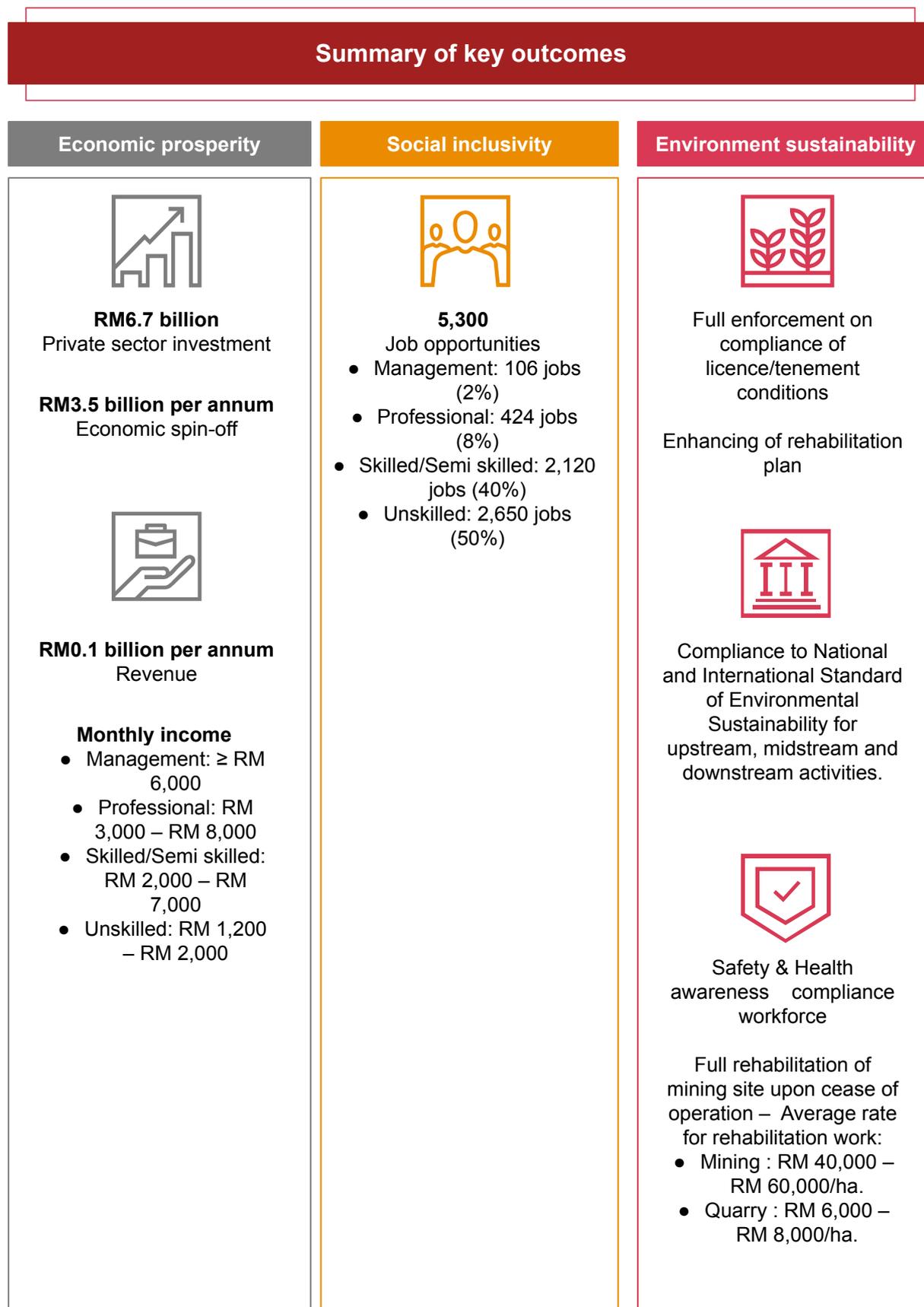


Figure 1.5.2: Summary of desired outcomes for mining sector

1.6 Social Services

Aspiration for Social Services Sector

The State aims to provide high living standards, a healthy and inclusive society with affordable and innovative service delivery for Sarawakians. This aligns to aspirations for the social inclusivity pillar. The State government's agenda prioritises wellbeing of the people and this is exceptionally crucial during the pandemic and recovery stages.

Sarawak is rich with natural resources. However, there is still ample room for growth in terms of wealth distribution amongst Sarawakians. Efforts are underway to address household income of the lower and middle class and reduce the number of poor households in Sarawak.

Sarawak has one of the highest poverty rates in Malaysia, with 15.5% of households earning below RM2,000 per month versus the national equivalent of 8.8%. In addition to the assistance meted out by Federal government, the poor will be upskilled and empowered to reduce dependency on cash handouts from the State.

Figure 1.6.1: Aspiration framework for social services sector

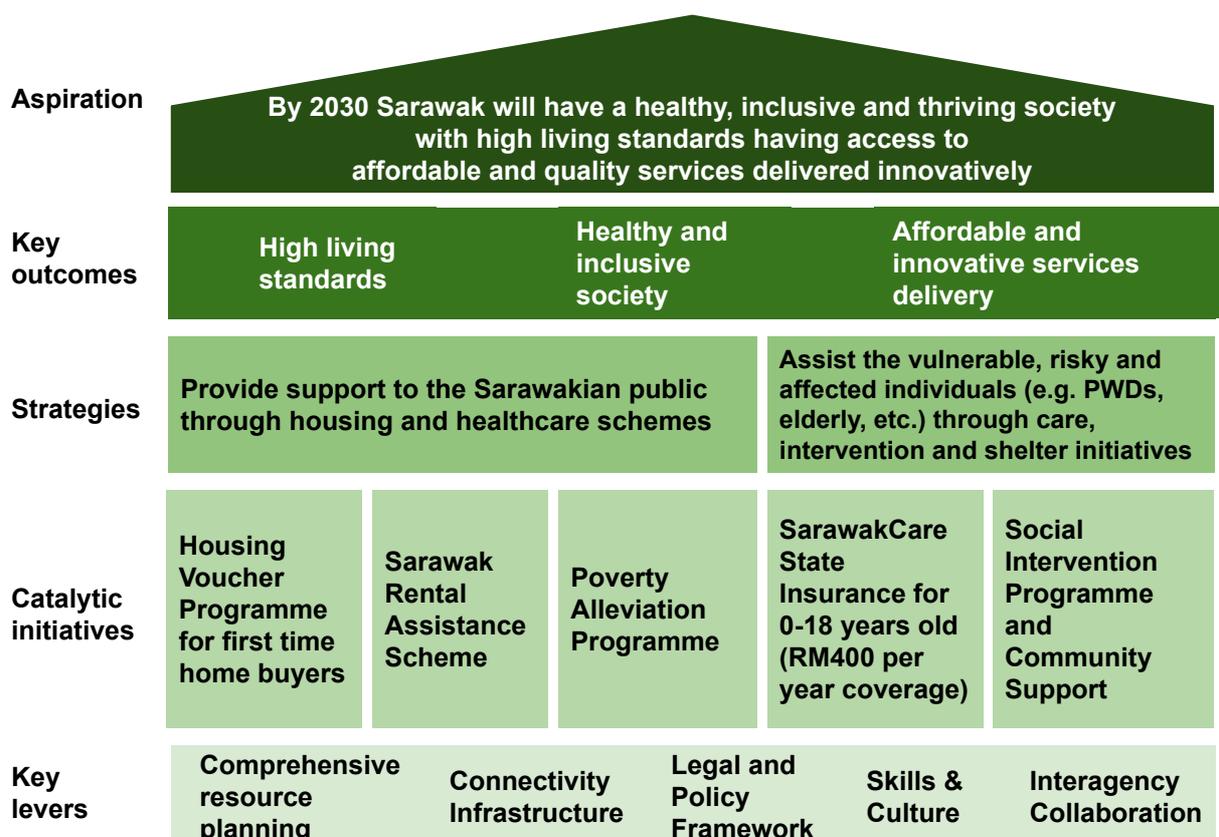
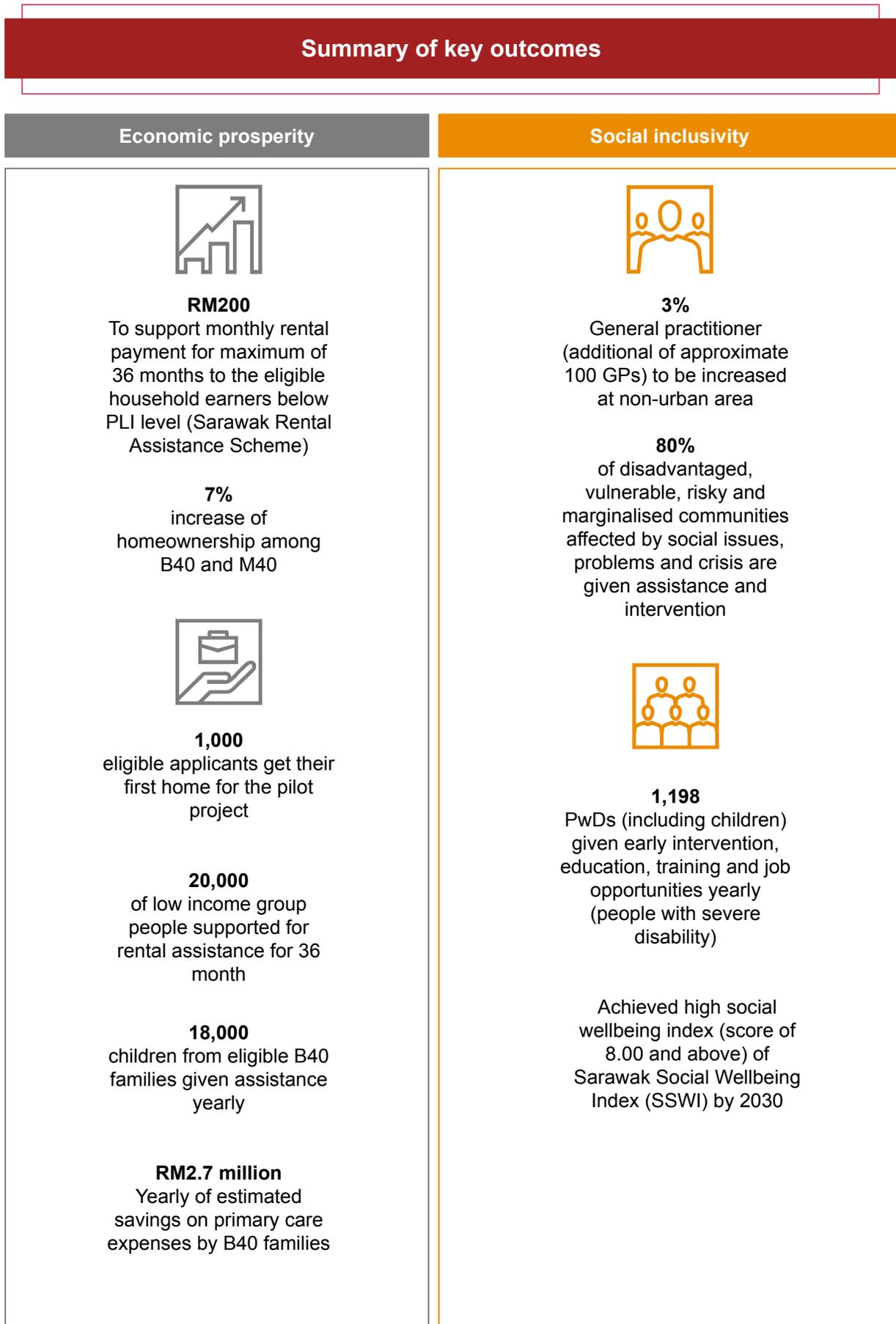


Figure 1.6.2: Summary of desired outcomes for social services sector
